SCHED is now open on the website. Pre-Registration will open Monday, December 9th, 2024, at 7:00 pm to allow equal access for all teachers. If a session has a fee attached, all members attending the session must pay the fee as it helps to pay for the session facilitator.

Please be mindful when choosing your sessions on SCHED. **As we near convention, please sign up for only one session per time slot.** On the Tuesday before the convention, the directors look at the number of people signed up for each session and move the sessions to smaller or larger rooms accordingly. Schedule postcards will be delivered to each school when they arrive, so teachers can create a list of all the sessions they are interested in attending.

This year, sessions will be located at the Edmonton Convention Centre (formally SHAW) and the Westin. There will be no free wifi at the Edmonton Convention Centre. Please be prepared to use personal cellular data or purchase access if you would like wifi at this location. There is free wifi access at the Westin Hotel.

You may be asked for your ATA card at convention. You can print or take a screenshot of your ATA card by logging into and accessing the members-only section of the <u>ATA website</u>. You may be redirected to a legacy website. If you look under your profile, you will find the section to view and print your card.

Substitute teachers and part-time teachers may attend both days of convention as long as they have their ATA card.

If you are interested in staying downtown during the convention, rate information can be found using this <u>link</u> or by looking at the accommodations section of the NCTCA website. **If booking** accommodations online, use the link provided above for the Westin or Chateau Lacombe or contact the hotels directly and ask for the NCTCA rate. Using the government rate on other hotel booking websites will not work as we are not considered direct government employees.
